ACTI

Basil: I am very impressed Jack; I thought you only knew "Conan the Barbarian" from the actors. You know who J Lo is eh? And, I am not sure Ann was in Rhodes either; but I am sure she was in Porto Heli! Here is how she looked then.

(Wait for several seconds here as the picture is posted)

<u>Jack:</u> oh no! this is not Ann; What is going on here Basil?

Basil: hey, Jack; listen. I am not crazy yet; I know this is not Ann; but I just wanted to check if your brain is working all right or if you started having Alzheimer problems; but I can see your mind is razor sharp!

Jack: Basil; I believe we are side tracking here; we are supposed to talk about the Athena Society; not J-Los Kate Upton and the like.

Basil: right; right; Let us talk Athena society now

ACT II

Basil: As I was telling you Jack, I have some thoughts about old age and how to handle it. Sometimes I sit down and think how our last moments would be.

And I did not tell you the best part; accuracy jack; hahaha the accuracy will be better than 99.99999% ... (continues)

I will make the Germans so jealous of my perfection. They will give up all of their standardizations and reference preparations. I will drive them out of business. I will be perfect, perfect, perfect Jack!

we just said; we were dreaming;

remember?

ACTIII

Basil: Jack I like this conversation about immortals. Is there any chance we become immortals?

Jack: yes there is

Basil: so what is it? How?

Jack: cloning Basil cloning. Go and clone yourself and that's it; you

Basil: what do I have to do?

become immortal.

Jack: they will take some hairs from you; you still have some, and it does not matter if they are snow white; then, they will put some chemicals to the cells they will get from your hair and culture them; they say that the chemicals will reprogram your cells to become pluripotent.

Basil: you are getting too technical jack; what is pluripotent?

Jack: your cells will become like a ...

Basil: So, what would be my modified name?

(Basil grimaces here and wait a few seconds)

Basil: (scratching his head) Jack I am a little worried now; what if I get some genes from the goat?

Jack: well it is a very remote possibility;
the other day I was told that out of
100,000 cloned individuals, only 3 had a
gene transfer from the goat.

Basil: (looks very scared and with a broken and stuttered voice): Gggggo on; gggggo on, I want to hear more.

Jack: since you asked for it, here is more. One guy inherited a goat gene for hair, and he came out totally normal except that he had a goat tee; here is how you will look if this ever happens to you... (continues)

(Show photoshop picture here (half screen for basil)



It is not bad; the famous Brad Pitt has the same goat tee.

Basil: aaaaahhhhhh I am scared; stop showing this picture now. And what about the second guy?

Jack: well, the second guy had a more serious side effect. He inherited an arm from the goat and he looked like this.

(Show photoshop picture and then zoom on the arm)



Basil:aaaaaaaaaaaahhhhhhhhhhhhh

hhhhhhhhhhhhh;that's terrible

Jack: terrible but rare basil; worth

taking your chances unless you

prefer to die!

Basil: (looks very agitated) tell me about the third guy

Jack: do you really want to hear? Here you go; the third guy had a something that is called a catastrophic event; he lost 90% of his DNA to a goat cell and he

came out like this.

(Show photoshop picture here of basil head on a whole goat. Goat



makes a mooooooo noise here (wait for several seconds before proceeding).

[Basil: termoring; shaking; desperate; loses consciousness and falls down for a few seconds .

Jack tries to revive him with various tricks]

Basil: (after he calms down) Jack I prefer to

die than being reborn a goat!

ACT IV

Jack: Basil, I do not blame you; I share your fears that cloning may degrade you from a great man to a goat. I have recently heard of another immortality technique that you may want to consider

Basil: what is it?

Jack: It is called fermionic regeneration. very, very high tech; it was published in Nature magazine a few months ago and invented by a guy by the name of James Wesley Rogers; he claims that he can adjust your new life to age 21; forever!!

Basil: how can I learn more?

Jack: well it is by interview only; if you want to learn more you will have to go by yourself; they will not even allow Maria to be there; strictly confidential; somebody told me the first thing they do it to estimate your time of death; they go by an accuracy of a few milliseconds; this is how good they are... (continues)

Then, they tell you if you want to be regenerated after your death; you apply, sign the contract and then wait for the time; when it comes, you go in and after a short interview they do it on the spot; you do not even need to be fasted.

Basil: is it safe?

Jack: hahahahaaha safe? Do not ask
stupid questions Basil; we are talking
after you die here; not before; so, it is ...
very safe. Do you want to try?

Basil: well I have no option really; it is between death and immortality; and I choose the second.

Jack: what should I tell Maria if she asks? Basil: tell her that I will be immortal and if I am the same as before, and I am sure I will be, I will keep loving her; but never promise I will marry her again; tell her I will look for her in the new life and leave

it at that.

Jack: what does "look for her" means?

Jack: ok; got it; here is the tel # of this company; they call themselves "from here to eternity" And here is a telephone. Call them.

(Basil hesitates a bit and then decides calling the number ...)

Basil: Hello; is this from here to eternity?

(Show split screen with the two talking people on their phones; the lady could be in a living room or something)

TL: (kind of laughing) from here to...
what? Eternity? No sir, eternity is not
here.

Basil: where is she?

TL: How should I know where is she sir? Eternity is gone, forever.

Basil: But I want to have an appointment with her!

TL: You want to have an appointment with who?

Basil: Eternity

TL: Why?

Basil: Iwant to be immortal with this new method; fermionic regeneration.

(Some voices or laughs from the line; showing the other person in split screen)

TL: what is your name sir?

Basil: Basil

TL: Well...Basil, you need to see a psychiatrist right now, oryou must be a complete moron

Basil: Hey, do you know to whom you are talking to? The great Basil Doumas, ex-President of AACC! TL: Yeah, yeah,and do you know who am I? I am the President of the United States; you have the wrong number; you moron!

ACT V

FRR: this is an important message from the Central Existence Committee. First, we would like to check our equipment. It is about life and death here; make sure you do not make lethal mistakes Mr Doumas! Press button 1 please. (Basil presses 1 and the sound comes; he tries to dance to the rhythm) (continues)

FRR: Ok Mr Doumas; press button 2

now. (Basil presses 2 and the sound comes; he tries to dance to the rhythm)

Ok Mr Doumas; press button 3 now.

(Basil presses 3 and the sound comes; he tries to dance to the rhythm)

(continues)

FRR: I can see you are in good mood Mr Doumas: Press 1 to receive this message in English. Press 2 to receive this message in Greek. Press 3 to have this message directly injected into your brain using Chomsky universal grammar. You have three seconds to choose... (continues)

(Basil seems hesitant and a little confused but then presses a button. There will be childish music from the drum here, but it is ok; Basil moves to the rhythm; looks in great mood. From here, FRR apprears on a TV monitor with tech around her)

FRR: Congratulations, Mr. Doumas. We have confirmed that you have less than 6 weeks to live. You are now eligible for total fermionic regeneration. *(continues)*

Your application has been approved with a continuity coefficient of 0.8 (80%). You will be regenerated via a process originally developed for quantum teleportation. First, you will be subatomically scanned, using what is referred to as a.... 'destructive read'. Essentially, your body will be completely destroyed as it is converted into pure information. (continues) Next, we will apply powerful errorcorrecting algorithms to your data, and reconstitute your body with all pathological conditions eliminated. Your data will not be shared with any third party. During reconstitution, your personality will be slightly altered, using a simple linear interpolation between yourself (80%) and a standard personality template (20%). (continues)

Your continuity coefficient of 0.8 (80%) was determined by a number of factors: 1) Your current profession, Clinical Chemist, is considered nonessential or even, totally useless. (Basil grimaches here). By adjusting your aptitudes, we hope to nudge you towards a more useful vocation, such as obesity counselling or motivational performance art. (continues)

2) You have a poor record of separating your recyclables. (Basil grimaches here). To have any chance at all of being an effective obesity counsellor, you will need a greater sense of civic responsibility. 3) We have detected a disturbing pattern of negativity towards Canadian pop stars on your social media accounts. (continues)

(Basil grimaches here). Such cynicism and poor aesthetic judgment have no place in an enlightened society. As your continuity coefficient is less than the legal threshold of 94% established by Jones-B v. California, your derived self will not legally be Basil Doumas, but rather your direct descendent, Basil Doumas-B. (continues)

You may transfer up to 100% of your current assets to Basil Doumas-B without probate or inheritance tax. (Basil grimaces) here but looks approving and happy). Your academic and professional qualifications will also be transferred, contingent on a series of review examinations. Basil Doumas-B's age will be legally established as 21 at the time of regeneration. (continues) (Basil grimaches here but looks very happythumbs up here). Any contractual agreement, including marriage, to which Basil Doumas is a party may be voided at this time. Press 1 to review frequently asked questions about fermionic regeneration. Press 2 to proceed directly to the next section. You have three seconds to choose.

Basil: three seconds?

(Another music piece from drum here but Basil moves to rhythm with hesitance).

FRR: You chose Frequently asked questions.

Basil: yes, I have some questions; Will the reconstituted person really be me?

FRR: For a continuity coefficient of 1.0

(100%), the general consensus is yes, both legally and ontologically. For lower continuity coefficients, like yours (I remind you, 80%) there is much debate. But ask yourself this: am I the same person when I wake up in the morning as I was the night **before?** (continues)

Research has shown that during periods of intense synaptic reorganization, the continuity coefficient of someone waking from a deep sleep can be as low as 0.996 (99.6%) As neural adaptation and memory degradation accumulate every day, are you still the same person you were one year ago? (continues)

It has been postulated that a human being is not one continuous person throughout his or her life, but rather a sequence of discrete persons, each with merely a perception of continuity with the preceding individuals. (Basil grimaces here). Perhaps it is this perception of continuity that is the functional definition of a soul. (continues)

If that is the case, and your derived self has this perception of continuity with you, then he or she will be you in the only meaningful sense.

The most we can say then, is that there is a very high probability that your derived self will have a perception of continuity with you.

Basil: What about my loved ones?

FRR: All memories of your friends and family members will be transferred, and your derivative self may retain some of your emotional attachment to them.

Basil: Some? Woooo; this looks interesting! Will I ever need to be regenerated again?

FRR: Barring accident, no. Genetic and cellular improvements made during error correction will result in a derivative body that can be indefinitely maintained in optimal condition by conventional therapies.

Basil: Will you keep a back-up of my data?

FRR: Unfortunately, this is a practical impossibility. The amount of information needed to encode a human being at the subatomic level is unimaginably huge. At this time, we possess only enough informationstorage capacity to temporarily encode a single human being, and to keep one standard template. Basil: I've heard that the standard personality template is legendary Canadian pop star Justin Bieber. Is that true?

(Show a picture of Justin Bieber here)



FRR: We can neither confirm nor deny this rumour; and this is the end of the question period Dr Doumas. Once again, Mr. Doumas, congratulations. You are about to embark on a great adventure.

(Then sirens start to make noise (see youtube link of fire engine siren). We alse need some flashing lights and a on-off light effect to show panicand a harsh voice (computerized) says:

Harsh Voice: Due to scheduling constraints, your regeneration must begin immediately. Should you choose to decline regeneration at this time, you will not be allowed to reapply. Press 1 to be completely regenerated into a functionally immortal form that will retain 80% of your current identity. Press 2 to decline regeneration and live for up to 6 more weeks as Basil Doumas. You have three seconds to choose.

Basil screams and raises his hands in panic but keep them up trying to decide from numbers 1,2,3. We end the act right there without showing what he chose

ACT VI

Epilogue

(Music and photos here)

Jack: so, Basil, I do not see you being 21 years old and I do not see you happy; what happened? You did not choose eternity?

Basil: those bastards jack; they had questions for me related to life and death and they gave me 3 seconds to respond; in fact, I answered all the questions on time except the last one; 3 seconds to choose between my current situation and fermionic regeneration; and with only 80% of retaining the real basil doumas I was scared and finally declined.

Jack: 80% seems good basil; you should have chosen to regenerate; and now, according to their rules, you cannot reapply.

Basil: they never told me which 80% will be retained jack; what if my genious with clinical chemistry was in the nonretained 20%? What if in the 20% were my good looks, my energy, my.....I do not know what. I do not want to be anybody else jack; not even 20%; let alone that their standard template is no else than...Justin Bieber!

Jack: I get you basil; but it is getting late and our Athenians are waiting for a good dinner. Why don't we leave this depressing discussion and go and have some fun?
