Thumbnail Summaries condense the background, methods, findings, and conclusions of the research into quick-to-use, single-page overviews that include reference information.

This digest is produced quarterly at the University of Toronto by the CHSRF/CIHR Health Services Chair in Health Care Settings and Canadians and remains the property of the Chair.

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This issue focuses on: quality of care, access and utilization, cost-effectiveness and service delivery. The following topical questions are addressed:

- 1. Does regulation ensure quality of care or better patient outcomes in LTC facilities?
- 2. Do patients support the use of computers to enhance the quality of health care?
- 3. What clinical and socioeconomic factors affect home care utilization?
- 4. Is home ownership a barrier to accessing long-term care?
- 5. Can injury prevention programs yield substantial cost savings in the acute and community care sectors?
- 6. Is an alternative model of early discharge for post-hip fracture rehabilitation cost effective?
- 7. What factors are required for successful implementation of evidence-based practice throughout organizational networks?
- 8. Will we have enough health care professionals trained in geriatric care to look after the elderly?
