Minimum Score Requirements:

TOEFL Paper-Based Test: Overall Score 580 and TWE 5

TOEFL Internet-Based Test (IBT): Overall Score 93 and Writing/Speaking 22

MELAB: 85

IELTS: 7.0 (Academic) with at least 6.5 for each component

COPE: 76 (with at least 22 in each component and 32 in the writing component)
