## **Getting your first recruit – part four**

At the Collaborators' Meeting four centres gave excellent presentations regarding recruitment strategies! We have decided to include some of these ideas here. This is the last installment of ideas from the Toronto Collaborators' Meeting. We hope that they will be useful to all centres! Dr. Mario Palermo and Ms. Veronica Favilla, Posadas, *Buenos Aires*, ARGENTINA, shared the following tips for getting your first recruit:

- Present the trial to all relevant departments to increase knowledge and interest in the trial, such as: the department of ultrasound, family practice, midwifery, etc.
- Post EECV2 Posters everywhere, for example in the outpatient area, obstetric ward, waiting rooms, delivery room, admission room, perinatal ultrasonography centre, patient washrooms in ultrasound area
- Create a research office with a focus on ECV
- Encourage staff training in ECV and simulator practice, if available
- Provide date wheels with inclusion and exclusion criteria, tape measures and brochures to practitioners

Just a quick reminder to please hold on to your original copies of patient informed consent forms. Neither the original nor a copy of the consent form should be sent to the Data Coordinating Centre. In order to keep the identity of the patient confidential we use only the patient study number and mother's date of birth as identifiers at the Data Coordinating Centre.
