#### **About Hamilton, Ontario**



- Hamilton, Ontario, is located at the head of Lake Ontario, between Niagara Falls and Toronto, right in the centre of what is known as the Golden Horseshoe.
- Hamilton is the eighth largest city in Canada with the third highest proportion of foreign-born citizens after Toronto (44%) and Vancouver (38%).
- Hamilton Harbour was discovered by explorer Robert Cavelier De La Salle in 1669. First Nations Peoples who lived in villages scattered around the harbour named it Macassa Bay, meaning "beautiful water."
- Traditionally, the local economy was led by the <u>steel</u> and <u>heavy manufacturing</u> industries; however, within the last decade there has been a shift towards the service sector particularly health sciences.


#### Things to do and see in Hamilton



- Wander through the **Royal Botanical Gardens** considered the plant biodiversity hotspot for Canada with more than 1,100 species of plants grow within its boundaries.
- Hike along the **Bruce Trail** where <u>streams</u> and <u>rivers</u> flow over the Niagara Escarpment and check out the many <u>waterfalls</u>.
