Getting your first recruit

At the European Collaborators' Meeting in London three centres gave excellent presentations regarding recruitment strategies! We have decided to include some of these ideas here and in up-coming newsletters. We hope that they will be useful to all centres for recruitment! Ms Karen Canning at Coombe Women's Hospital in Dublin, shared the following tips for getting your first recruit:



- · Inform all care providers that provide care to pregnant women about the trial
- · Provide Inclusion/Exclusion criteria and timeframes to all care providers
- · Use promotional materials e.g, place posters in all out-patient rooms and in the ultrasound department
- · Introduce yourself to all the care providers and make yourself known
- · Speak about trial at any available opportunity.
