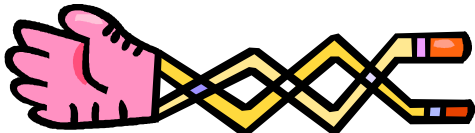


## Recruitment Recognition!

## Changes at Children's & Women's Health Centre of BC

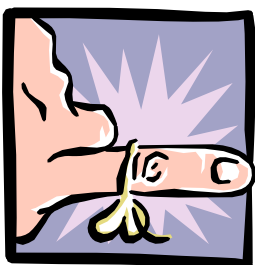
