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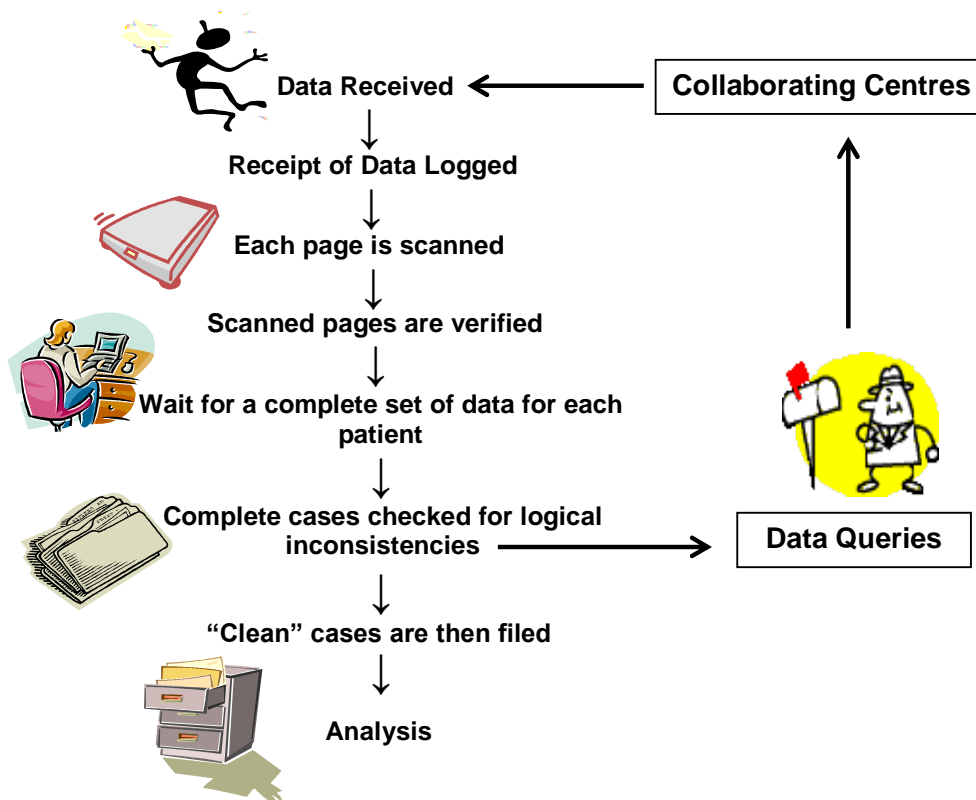

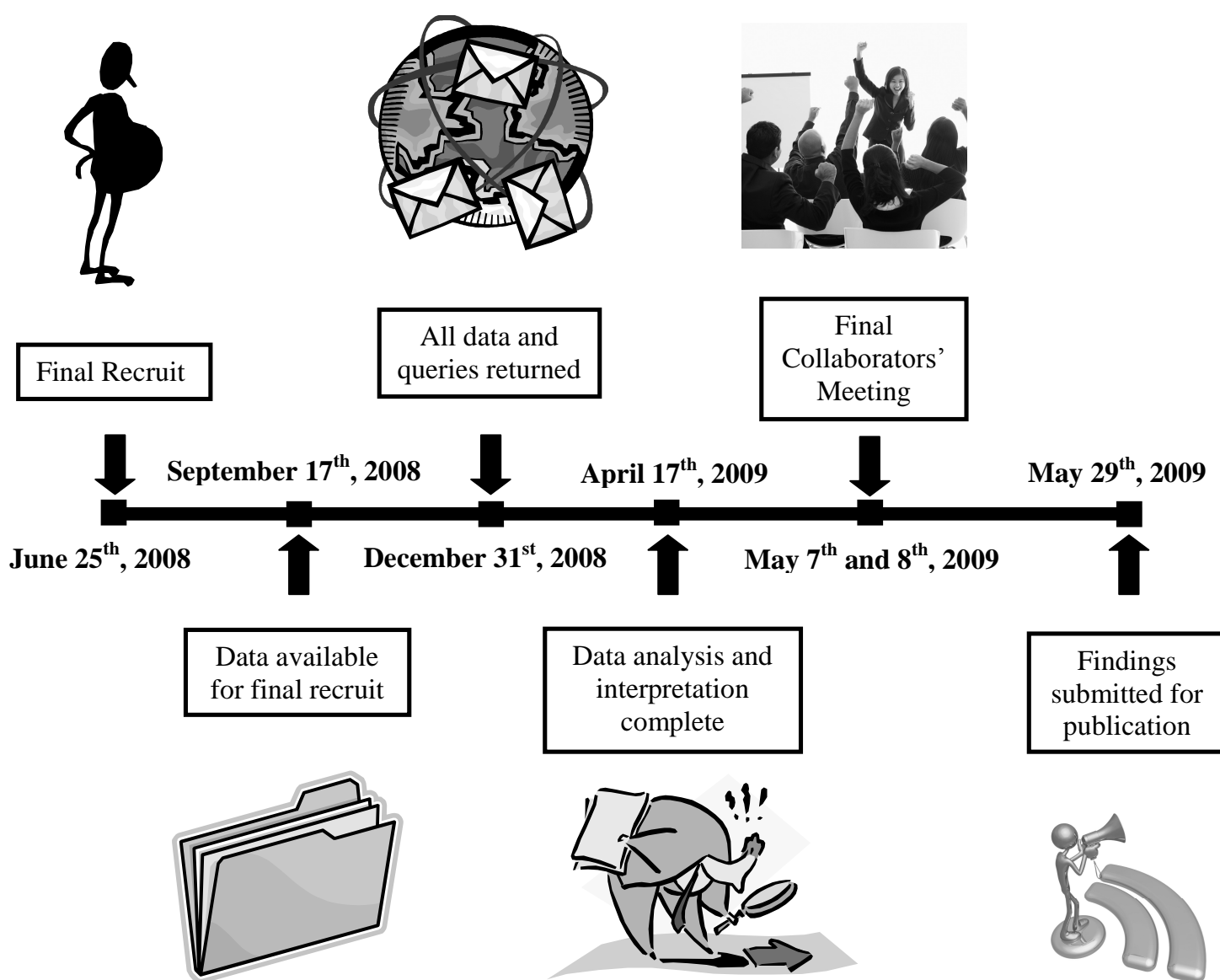
Congratulations all - we're now in the analysis phase of the trial!

Now that we've reached (and surpassed!) our recruitment goal of 1526 women for the EECV2 Trial we need to focus on our new goal: to have complete data, free of any queries for the final analysis! We are counting on all of our collaborators to return the data to us as soon as possible so we can send out any queries quickly. In addition, we need you to respond to the queries as soon as you can so the data can be clean and ready for analysis. We've included a flow chart below of what happens to the data once you return it to us. The process we go through to verify the data takes some time, so the sooner you can return it to us, the better!



Our Timeline

Our goal is to have all the data and queries complete by December 31st, 2008 so we can meet to discuss the study findings on May 7th and 8th in Hamilton, Ontario, CANADA! We need your help to be able to accomplish this goal so please send all your data forms to us and respond to any queries as quickly as you can! We know it will take a little time for the data of the last women recruited to be available for collection so we've allowed time for both that and the process the data must go through once it reaches the coordinating centre. We do plan to begin the final analysis in the New Year and have the database closed by the end of 2008.



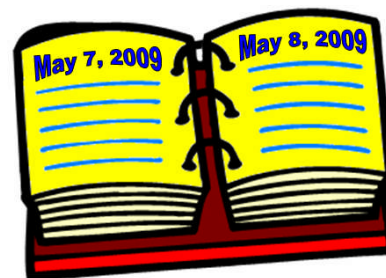
Data Campaign

In September we will start reporting the number of successful cases of complete and clean data. This means there are no outstanding queries and the data is ready for final analysis. Our goal will be to have 100% complete and clean data for all of the centres.

In future newsletters we will start to celebrate each centre that has been successful in returning their forms and queries and are ready for the analysis! We know that not all of you will be able to meet this goal right away as you recruited women recently and they have yet to deliver but we look forward to seeing all of our collaborating centres on this list before December 31st, 2008.
