

Race to the Finish – with a Cool Down Period!

As you all know, we're closing in on our recruitment goal with just **38** women left to enroll before reaching 1460 women recruited. As it is difficult to estimate when the final woman will be enrolled, and many of our collaborators may be speaking with women right up until the last day, we will be extending recruitment for two weeks after

the 1460th woman is randomised into the trial. This will allow you to include any interested and eligible women you have approached leading up to this point. However, we suggest that you do not approach any new women about the trial once 1460 women have been randomised as there may not be time to enroll them before the randomisation



database is closed. We will keep all of you updated in our daily recruitment e-mail with the number of days left in the extended "cool down" period after our race to the finish!
