Questions from our centres:

What happens if a women refuses the ECV procedure?

It is important that we collect complete data on all women who are randomised into the trial.

Occasionally, even with excellent informed consent, women may decide that they don't want to have a procedure done after they have been enrolled in the trial. Although we don't expect this to happen often, if this situation arises you should assure the woman that this is OK and let her know that if she changes her mind again, she can book a procedure later. You should also let her know that her opinions are an important part of the trial and that you will contact her after her baby is born to ask her how she felt about her involvement in the trial. You should then collect all of the data for her and complete all of the data forms with the exception of the Procedure Form and the Mother's ECV Questionnaire.



Maternal experience of pain during external cephalic version at term

This study was designed to investigate maternal pain perception during ECV. 97 women with a singleton breech were asked to rate the degree of pain experienced during ECV performed without analgesia on a visual anologue scale (similar to the one being used in the EECV2 study: Mother's ECV Questionaire). The investigators found that although ECV was associated with a moderate degree of pain, the procedure was well tolerated by a majority of the women because of its short duration.
