Neonatal Form Question 16

In some centres the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU or level 3 nursery) and the intermediate nursery (level 2) are combined. For babies in a centre with a combined NICU and intermediate nursery, please record the baby's length of stay in hospital as in the intensive care nursery. For example, Baby Jones was in the hospital for 5 days. Three of the 5 days were spent in the combined nursery and the other 2 days in the regular nursery
