



What is the time-span between the pre-study course of ACS and randomisation?


Women are only eligible for randomisation into MACS between 14-21 days after their pre-study course of ACS. Then immediately after randomisation the patients should be given their first dose of the MACS study drug.

For example, if a patient received her pre-study ACS on a Wednesday, then they should be randomised after 14 days which is two Wednesdays later.

How do I use the *Treatment* and *Offsite Treatment Forms*?

We <u>must</u> have a *Treatment Form* back for every patient. In order to keep our records complete, please also send the completed *Offsite Treatment Form* to the Data Coordinating Centre if it is used.

It is important that the treatment form is filled in completely, up to and including page 3. If the maximum number of possible treatments is not given, please fill out the 'N/A' boxes that correspond to these courses.
