#### **GOOD NEWS:** The Suspension of Recruitment Ended March 12, 2004

As our international colleagues at our active sites already know, senior administrative officers at Sunnybrook & Women's College Health Sciences Centre (SWCHSC) after much discussion and a final meeting held by teleconference on March 11, 2004, came to an agreement that the MIRU trials that had recently been suspended internationally should be started up again immediately. This decision was based on the extremely low level of risk involved relative to the importance of the research under way.



We were therefore able to re-open recruitment on Friday March 12.
