#### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR ME?


- digital projection in smaller classrooms (finally!)



#### WHAT AND WHY

The TSJ will bring smaller classrooms up to a minimum standard of A/V equipment:

Digital Projector and Screen

Standard A/V hookup and controls

Live Intercom Support

**UTORid** login

Height-adjustable lectern

Stable fixed laptop platform

### WHAT IT IS NOT

It is not a 'full' Teaching Station - smaller classrooms require something smaller and less expensive. It has no on-board computer, no microphone or reading light, and no built-in DVD or VCR.

So it has the basics - projector, screen, A/V support, inputs, and importantly, a standard identical interface for smaller classrooms.
